The number of retirement-age households facing cost burdens has reached an all-time high,¹ and homelessness among older adults is expected to nearly <u>triple</u> by 2030.²



PREVENT OLDER ADULTS FROM

EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS:

In Massachusetts, older adults make up 38% of extremely low income renter households.³



Older adults living alone in Massachusetts are more likely to face economic insecurity than other older adults living alone in any other state.⁴



The cost of living for older adult couples who rent is the highest in Massachusetts (\$51,276, which is 124% of the national average)⁴.

- Provide \$60 million in the Housing Bond Bill, also known as the Affordable Homes Act (<u>House Bill 4138</u>), to create bridge subsidies for up to 6,000 older adults, aged 60 years and older, facing housing instability to allow them to remain in place while they await approval for long-term subsidized housing, through programs such as state-funded public housing, the Massachusetts Rental Voucher Program (MRVP), the Housing Choice Voucher Program (Section 8).
- Low-income older adults participating in the bridge subsidy program would pay 30% of their income towards rent, with the bridge subsidy making up the difference in the total rent, up to 110% of the fair market rent. The program would be administered by the Executive Office of Elder Affairs (EOEA) in collaboration with the Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (EOHLC).
